Must practice these Assertion/Reason questions

Q.1 Assertion (A): The making of the global world has a long history involving trade, migration, movement of people for work and the movement of capital.

Reason (R): From ancient times, travellers, traders, priests and pilgrims travelled vast distances carrying goods, money, values, skills, ideas and inventions with them.

- (A) Both A and R are true and R is the correct explanation of A.
- (B) Both A and R are true but R is not the correct explanation of A.
- (C) A is true but R is false.
- (D) A is false but R is true.

Q.2 Assertion (A): The silk routes created vibrant trade and cultural links between distant parts of the world.

Reason (R): Early Christian missionaries, Muslim preachers and Buddhist monks used the silk routes to travel to different regions.

- (A) Both A and R are true and R is the correct explanation of A.
- (B) Both A and R are true but R is not the correct explanation of A.
- (C) A is true but R is false.
- (D) A is false but R is true.

Q.3 Assertion (A): Chinese silk was the only important commodity that moved along the silk routes.

Reason (R): Chinese pottery, Indian and Southeast Asian textiles and spices also travelled along the same routes, while gold and silver flowed from Europe to Asia.

Q.4 Assertion (A): Many common foods in Europe and Asia, such as potatoes and maize, have been known there since ancient times.

Q.5 Assertion (A): Spaghetti in Italy and noodles in China may have a connected history.

Reason (R): It is believed that noodles travelled west from China to become spaghetti, or that Arab traders took pasta to Sicily in the fifth century.

Q.6 Assertion (A): The Irish peasants suffered terribly when the potato crop failed in the mid-1840s.

Q.9 Assertion (A): Before its 'discovery', America had been cut off from regular contact with the rest of the world for millions of years.

Reason (R): Before the sixteenth century, America had a dense network of regular ocean trade with Europe and Asia.

- (B) Both A and R are true but R is not the correct explanation of A.
- (C) A is true but R is false.

Q.10 Assertion (A): Silver from the Americas played an important role in financing Europe's trade with Asia.

Reason (R): Precious metals, particularly silver, from mines in present-day Peru and Mexico enhanced Europe's wealth and financed its trade with Asia.
